ENFORCEMENT NOTICE



OPERATIONAL DEVELOPMENT

The Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended)

ISSUED BY THE CITY AND COUNTY OF SWANSEA ("The Council") COUNCIL REFERENCE ENF2020/0304

1. **THIS NOTICE** is issued by the Council because it appears to them that there has been a breach of planning control under Section 171A(1)(a) of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 at the land described below. They consider that it is expedient to issue this Notice having regard to the provisions of the development plan and all other material planning considerations. The **annex** at the end of the Notice contains important additional information.

2. THE LAND TO WHICH THIS NOTICE RELATES

Land at Old Farm Close, adjacent to 166 Swansea Road, Waunarlwydd, Swansea, SA5 4SR in the City and County of Swansea ("the Land"), shown edged red on the plan appended hereto ("the Plan").

3. THE MATTERS WHICH APPEAR TO CONSTITUTE THE BREACH OF PLANNING CONTROL

Without planning permission, the erection of a pair of large gates at the entrance to the new development known as Old Farm Close and failure to provide and implement the required separate pedestrian footpath and vehicular entrances to the site, in accordance with the plans and schemes approved under historic planning permissions.

4. REASONS FOR ISSUING THIS NOTICE

It appears to the Council that the above breach of planning control has occurred within the last four years.

Failure to provide the approved separate pedestrian footpath and entrance into the site is likely to result in pedestrian and vehicular conflict both at the point of entry to the site (junction with Swansea Road) and within the development site (at the gates), contrary to Policy PS2 of the of the Swansea Local Development Plan 2010-2025 and to the guidance provided in the adopted SPGs relevant to those earlier planning permissions

5. WHAT YOU ARE REQUIRED TO DO

(i) Remove the pair of large gates along with all fittings and fixtures in their entirety from the entrance to the site;

(ii) Provide and construct the separate pedestrian footpath and vehicular access into/out of the site, together with the additional pedestrian gate and associated pillar, as approved under application reference numbers 2018/0975/FUL, 2018/2576/DOC, 2020/0369/FUL, 2020/1146/FUL, 2020/2247/DOC, 2021/2247/FUL and 2021/0406/FUL and as illustrated on the Site Layout Plans relating to each of those applications.

6. TIME FOR COMPLIANCE

6 months beginning with the day on which this notice takes effect.

7. WHEN THIS NOTICE TAKES EFFECT

This Notice takes effect on the 17th February 2023, unless an appeal is made against it before that date.

WHAT HAPPENS IF YOU DO NOT APPEAL

If you do not appeal against this Enforcement Notice, it will take effect on the date specified in paragraph 7 of the Notice and you must then ensure that the required steps for complying with it, for which you may be held responsible, are taken within the period(s) specified in paragraph 6 of the Notice. Failure to comply with the Enforcement Notice which has taken effect can result in prosecution and/or remedial action by the Council.
