THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF SWANSEA (hereinafter called "the Council") in exercise of its powers under Sections the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1984") and the Traffic Management Act 2004 and the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 and Section 124 of the Act of 1984 hereby make the following Order.

SECTION 1 – PRELIMINARY

Citation and commencement

 This Order shall come into operation on 6th June 2024 and may be cited as the Council of the City and County of St Thomas Ward (Various Restriction) Swansea Order 2024

Definitions

2. In this order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meaning hereby respectively assigned to them:

"Civil Enforcement Officer" has the same meaning as in Section 63A of the Act of 1984 and by virtue of Section 76 of the 2004 Act a Civil Enforcement Officer appointed under Section 63A of the Act of 1984 is a Civil Enforcement Officer in relation to parking contraventions;

"Disabled Person's Badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (Wales) Regulation 2000;

"Parking Disc" means a disc issued by a Local Authority complying with the requirements of the British Standard Specifications for Parking Discs to comply with the European Blue Badge Scheme being a disc coloured blue and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins; "Public Service Vehicles" means a vehicle carrying passengers for a fee and for the purposes of this Order Public Service Vehicles refers to a large Public Service Vehicles capable of carrying more than eight passengers;

"Relevant Position" in respect of:-

- (a) a Disabled Person's Badge and Parking Disc has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (Wales) Regulations 2000; and
- (b) a permit means exhibited on the windscreen, dashboard or fascia of the vehicle or, where the vehicle does not have a windscreen, dashboard or fascia, in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that the whole of the information on the front of the permit is clearly legible from outside the vehicle;
- (c) a Waiver means exhibited on the windscreen, dashboard or fascia of the vehicle or, where the vehicle does not have a windscreen, dashboard or fascia, in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that the whole of the information on the front of the Waiver is clearly legible from outside the vehicle;

"Virtual Parking Permit" means an electronic record of parking ticket, permit or dispensation issued and confirmed by the Council to exempt a vehicle from a restriction or to make payment other than on site covered in the provisions of this order, under the terms applicable at the time of issue. A Virtual Parking Permit may be obtained by any of the methods provided from time to time by the Council and to be valid must be registered on an account in an electronic database approved by the Council with an indication that the permit has been issued and validated in accordance with Council procedures.

"Waiver" means a Waiver issued by the Council in respect of vehicles being used for building maintenance repair shop fitting or other industrial or demolition operations and the Council may charge for such Waiver such charge to be determined from time to time by resolution of the Council or relevant Committee thereof;

Interpretation

- Except where otherwise stated, any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order
- 4. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the Interpretation of an Act of Parliament
- The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any other prohibition or restriction whether made under the Act of 1984 or otherwise

SECTION 2 - NO WAITING AT ANY TIME

6. Save as provided in Articles 7 and 8 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer, police officer in uniform, or a person authorised by the Council, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on the length or lengths of the road or roads referred to in Schedule 2 hereto.

- 7. Nothing in Article 6 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the side or sides or length or lengths of the road or roads specified therein for as long as may be necessary to enable:
 - a. the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations namely:-
 - (i) building, maintenance, repair, shop fitting or other industrial or demolition operations with a Waiver issued by the Council and displayed in the Relevant Position on the windscreen of the vehicle;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said lengths or sides of the road of any sewer or any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of water, gas electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined by the Telecommunications Act 1984
 - (iv) a vehicle being used for police, Ambulance, fire brigade or other emergency purposes

- b. the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with the service of a local authority or of a water authority in pursuance of its statutory powers and duties.
- c. the vehicle of the Royal Mail or other universal services provider as defined in Section 27 of the Postal Services Act 2011 to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting mail.
- d. Public Service Vehicles when waiting at an authorised Bus stop to set down or pick up passengers
- e. vehicles picking up and dropping off passengers
- 8. Nothing in Article 6 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the Relevant Position a Disabled Persons Badge and a Parking Disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait on lengths of sides of roads referred to in the Article for a period not exceeding 3 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than 1 hour from the previous period of waiting by the same vehicle on the same length of side of road on which that vehicle had previously been waiting.

SECTION 3 - DISABLED PERSONS' PARKING PLACES

9. Save as provided in Articles 10 and 11 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer, police officer in uniform, or a person authorised by the Council, cause or permit any vehicle to stop at any time on any of the length or lengths of the road or roads referred to in Schedule 3 hereto.

- 10. Nothing in Article 9 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle displaying a Disabled Persons Badge and a Parking Disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) in the Relevant Position to park on the side or sides or length or lengths of the road or roads specified in Schedule 3.
- 11. Nothing in Article 9 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to stop on the side or sides or length or lengths of the road or roads specified therein for as long as may be necessary to enable:-

- (a) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations namely:-
 - (i) building, maintenance, repair, shop fitting or other industrial or demolition operations with a Waiver issued by the Council and displayed in the Relevant Position on the windscreen of the vehicle:
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said lengths or sides of the road of any sewer or any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of water, gas electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined by the Telecommunications Act 1984
 - (iv) a vehicle being used for police, Ambulance, fire brigade or other emergency purposes
- (b) the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with the service of a local authority or of a water authority in pursuance of its statutory powers and duties.
- (c) the vehicle of the Royal Mail or other universal services provider as defined in Section 27 of the Postal Services Act 2011 to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting mail.
- (d) vehicles picking up and dropping off passengers

SECTION 4 - RESIDENT PERMIT HOLDERS ONLY

12. Save as provided in Articles 13 and 14 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer, police officer in uniform, or a person authorised by the Council, cause or permit any vehicle to stop at any time on any of the length or lengths of the road or roads referred to in Schedule 4 hereto.

Exemptions

13. Nothing in Article 12 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle displaying a physical permit in the Relevant Position or subject to a Virtual Parking Permit covering the specified area to stop on the side or sides or length or lengths of the road or roads specified in Schedule 4.

- 14. Nothing in Article 12 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to stop on the side or sides or length or lengths of the road or roads specified therein for as long as may be necessary to enable:-
 - (a) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations namely:-
 - (i) building, maintenance, repair, shop fitting or other industrial or demolition operations with a Waiver issued by the Council and displayed in the Relevant Position on the windscreen of the vehicle;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said lengths or sides of the road of any sewer or any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of water, gas electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined by the Telecommunications Act 1984
 - (iv) a vehicle being used for police, Ambulance, fire brigade or other emergency purposes
 - (b) the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with the service of a local authority or of a water authority in pursuance of its statutory powers and duties.

SECTION 5 - LIMITED WAITING 1 HOUR NO RETURN WITHIN 2 HOURS MON-SAT 8AM – 6PM RESIDENT PERMIT HOLDERS EXEMPT

14. Save as provided in Articles 17, 18 and 19 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer, police officer in uniform, or a person authorised by the Council, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between 8 AM and 6PM Monday to Saturday for a period of time in excess 1 hour separated by a period of 2 hours on any of the length or lengths of the road or roads referred to in Schedule 5 hereto.

- 15. Save as provided in Articles 17 and 18 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer, police officer in uniform, or a person authorised by the Council, cause or permit any vehicle to wait between 6PM and 8AM Monday to Saturday on any of the length or lengths of the road or roads referred to in Schedule 5 hereto.
- 16. Where Article 15 applies no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer, police officer in uniform, or a person authorised by the Council, cause or permit any vehicle displaying a Disabled Person's Badge within a designated permit only parking bay.

- 17. Nothing in Article 14 and 15 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle displaying a physical permit in the Relevant Position or subject to a Virtual Parking Permit covering the specified area to wait on the side or sides or length or lengths of the road or roads specified in Schedule 5.
- 18. Nothing in Article 14 and 15 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the side or sides or length or lengths of the road or roads specified therein for as long as may be necessary to enable:-
 - (a) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations namely:-
 - (i) building, maintenance, repair, shop fitting or other industrial or demolition operations with a Waiver issued by the Council and displayed in the Relevant Position on the windscreen of the vehicle;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said lengths or sides of the road of any sewer or any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of water, gas electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined by the Telecommunications Act 1984

- 19. Nothing in Article 14 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the Relevant Position a Disabled Persons Badge and a Parking Disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait on lengths of sides of roads referred to in the Article for a period not exceeding 3 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than 1 hour from the previous period of waiting by the same vehicle between in the hours of 8AM 6PM on Monday to Saturday inclusive, on the same length of side of road on which that vehicle had previously been waiting.

SECTION 6 - PERMIT HOLDERS ONLY AT ANY TIME

- 20. Save as provided in Articles 22 and 23 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer, police officer in uniform, or a person authorised by the Council, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on any of the length or lengths of the road or roads and referred to in Schedule 6 hereto.
- 21. Where Article 20 applies no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer, police officer in uniform, or a person authorised by the Council, cause or permit any vehicle displaying a Disabled Person's Badge to wait within a designated permit only parking bay.

- 22. Nothing in Article 20 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle displaying a physical permit in the Relevant Position or subject to a Virtual Parking Permit covering the specified area to wait on the side or sides or length or lengths of the road or roads specified in Schedule 6.
- 23. Nothing in Article 20 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the side or sides or length or lengths of the road or roads specified therein for as long as may be necessary to enable:-
 - (a) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations namely:-

- (i) building, maintenance, repair, shop fitting or other industrial or demolition operations with a Waiver issued by the Council and displayed in the Relevant Position on the windscreen of the vehicle;
- (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
- (iii) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said lengths or sides of the road of any sewer or any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of water, gas electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined by the Telecommunications Act 1984
- (iv) a vehicle being used for police, Ambulance, fire brigade or other emergency purposes
- (b) the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with the service of a local authority or of a water authority in pursuance of its statutory powers and duties.

ST THOMAS WARD COMMUNITY BUDGET PROPOSALS

double yellow lines is for the purpose of improving road safety at road junctions for motorists and pedestrians

disabled persons parking places is for the purpose of assisting disabled persons to park outside their homes

the increase in the length of resident parking bays and limited waiting bays is to compensate for the placing of a disabled persons' parking place within that bay

Extract from RTRA 1984

2What a traffic regulation order may provide.

- (1) A traffic regulation order may make any provision prohibiting, restricting or regulating the use of a road, or of any part of the width of a road, by vehicular traffic, or by vehicular traffic of any class specified in the order,—
- (a) either generally or subject to such exceptions as may be specified in the order or determined in a manner provided for by it, and
- (b) subject to such exceptions as may be so specified or determined, either at all times or at times, on days or during periods so specified.
