- 1. The Council considers that there has been a breach of planning control on the land described in paragraph 4 below. The breach of planning control is 'without planning permission, the demolition of a stone-faced retaining wall and excavation works'.
- 2. This stop notice is issued by the Council, in exercise of their power in section 183 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990, because they think that it is expedient that the activity specified in this notice should cease on the land described in paragraph 4 below and which is also covered by the Enforcement Notice served on Mr David Whitehead on this 15th day of August 2024 (Copy of Enforcement Notice at **Annex 1** to this notice). The Council now prohibits the carrying out of the activity specified in this notice.

3. **REASONS FOR ISSUING THIS NOTICE**

The unauthorised engineering operations have a negative impact on the visual amenities of the area and on the character of this part of the Port Eynon Conservation Area and this part of the Gower Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, contrary to Policies PS2, HC1 and ER4 of the Swansea Local Development Plan (2019).

The unauthorised engineering operations have the potential to have a harmful impact upon the stability of those properties situated to the north of the site known as Hillcrest, Greenways and Ty'r Gwynt and have the potential to have serious safety implications for the owners/occupiers of those properties. The unauthorised engineering operations also have the potential to be detrimental to the structural integrity of the Bryn Y Mor dwelling and have safety implications for its owner. The unauthorised engineering operations are therefore considered to be contrary to Policy RP7 of the Swansea Local Development Plan (2019).

4. THE LAND TO WHICH THIS NOTICE RELATES

Land at Bryn Y Mor, Port Eynon, Swansea, SA3 1NL in the City and County of Swansea ("the Land"), shown edged red on the plan appended hereto at **Annex 3** ("the Plan").

5. ACTIVITY TO WHICH THIS NOTICE RELATES

Without planning permission, the demolition of a stone-faced retaining wall and excavation works.

6. WHAT YOU ARE REQUIRED TO DO

Cease any further excavation works on the land and cease the removal of any excavated materials from the land.

7. WHEN THIS NOTICE TAKES EFFECT

This Notice takes effect on the 18th day of August 2024.

WARNING

THIS NOTICE TAKES EFFECT ON THE DATE SPECIFIED IN PARAGRAPH 7. THERE IS NO RIGHT OF APPEAL TO THE WELSH MINISTERS AGAINST THIS NOTICE.

It is an offence to contravene a stop notice after a site notice has been displayed or the temporary stop notice has been served on you (section 183 and 187(1) of the 1990 Act). If you then fail to comply with the stop notice you will be at risk of prosecution in the Magistrates' Court, for which the maximum penalty is £20,000 on summary conviction for a first offence and for any subsequent offence.

The fine on conviction on indictment is unlimited. If you are in any doubt about what this notice requires you to do, you should get in touch immediately with:
