SCHEDULE 1

REVOCATIONS

The existing Orders are revoked as far as they are inconsistent with the proposals hereinafter contained which relate to the length or lengths of the road or roads referred to in the schedules hereto.

PROHIBITION OF WAITING AT ANY TIME

MANOR ROAD

On its eastern side from a point 3.5 metres south of its junction with the southern kerbline of St Johns Road to a point 8.5 metres south of that point. Notice of Intent for the Traffic Regulation Order

VARIOUS RESTRICTIONS - CWMBWRLA WARD

The provision of:

Double yellow lines is for the purpose of improving road safety at road junctions for motorists and pedestrians.

Disabled persons parking places is for the purpose of assisting disabled persons to park outside their homes.

Permit Holders Parking is for the purpose of assisting residents to park near their homes.

Limited Waiting with exemption for permit holders is to manage the availability of on street parking.

Orders to be amended and Orders to be revoked are to reflect the current usage of the roads concerned.

STATEMENT OF REASONS

Notice of Intent for the Traffic Regulation Order

VARIOUS RESTRICTIONS - CWMBWRLA WARD

The provision of:

- A) avoiding danger to persons or other traffic using the road or any other road or for preventing the likelihood of any such danger arising, or

THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF SWANSEA (hereinafter called "the Council") in exercise of its powers under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended (hereinafter referred to as "the 1984 Act"), the Traffic Management Act 2004("the 2004 Act"), the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 ("the 1976 Act") and all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 and Section 124 of the 1984 Act hereby makes the following Order.

SECTION 1 - PRELIMINARY

Citation and commencement

 This Order shall come into operation on XX XXXXXX 2025 and may be cited as the Council of the City and County of Swansea, Traffic Regulation Order (Various Restrictions) Cwmbwrla Ward, Swansea Order 2025

Definitions

2. In this order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meaning hereby respectively assigned to them:

"Civil Enforcement Officer" has the same meaning as in Section 63A of the 1984 Act and by virtue of Section 76 of the 2004 Act a Civil Enforcement Officer appointed under Section 63A of the 1984 Act is a Civil Enforcement Officer in relation to parking contraventions;

"Disabled Person's Vehicle" has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemption for Disabled Persons) (Wales) Regulations 2000;

"Disabled Person's Badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles)(Wales) Regulation 2000;

"Parking Disc" means a disc and time clock (where appropriate) issued by a local authority complying with the requirements of the British Standard Specifications for Page 2 of 16

Parking Discs to comply with the European Blue Badge Scheme being a disc coloured blue and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins;

"Parking Permit" means a Virtual Parking Permit or Physical Permit issued by the Council covering the relevant length of road and is displayed in the Relevant Position;

"Physical Parking Permit" means a paper permit that the Council has issued to a resident who has satisfied the Council, by formal application;

"Relevant Position" in respect of:-

- (a) a Disabled Person's Badge and parking disc has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (Wales) Regulations 2000;
- (b) a Physical Parking Permit means exhibited on the windscreen, dashboard or fascia of the vehicle or, where the vehicle does not have a windscreen, dashboard or fascia, in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that the whole of the information on the front of the permit is clearly legible from outside the vehicle; and
- (c) a Waiver means exhibited on the windscreen, dashboard or fascia of the vehicle or, where the vehicle does not have a windscreen, dashboard or fascia, in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that the whole of the information on the front of the waiver is clearly legible from outside the vehicle;

"Virtual Parking Permit" means an electronic record of parking ticket, permit or dispensation issued and confirmed by the Council to exempt a vehicle from a restriction or to make payment other than on site covered in the provisions of this order, under the terms applicable at the time of issue. A Virtual Parking Permit may be obtained by any of the methods provided from time to time by the Council and to be valid must be registered on an account in an electronic database approved by the Council with an indication that the permit has been issued and validated in accordance with Council procedures.

"Waiver" means a Waiver issued by the Council in respect of vehicles being used for building maintenance repair shop fitting or other industrial or demolition operations and the Council may charge for such waiver such charge to be determined from time to time by resolution of the Council or relevant Committee thereof;

Interpretation

- 3. Except where otherwise stated, any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order
- 4. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the Interpretation of an Act of Parliament
- 5. The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any other prohibition or restriction whether made under the 1984 Act or otherwise

SECTION 2 - PROHIBITION OF WAITING AT ANY TIME

6. Save as provided in Articles 7 and 8 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer, police officer in uniform, or a person authorised by the Council, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on the length or lengths of the road or roads referred to in Schedule 2 hereto.

Exemptions

- 7. Nothing in Article 6 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the side or sides or length or lengths of the road or roads specified therein for as long as may be necessary to enable:-
 - (a) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations namely:-
 - (i) building, maintenance, repair, shop fitting or other industrial or demolition operations with a Waiver issued by the Council and displayed in the Relevant Position on the windscreen of the vehicle;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said lengths or sides of the road of any sewer or any main pipe or apparatus for the supply Page 4 of 16

of water, gas electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined by the Telecommunications Act 1984; or

- (iv) a vehicle being used for police, ambulance, fire brigade or other emergency purposes;
- (b) the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with the service of a local authority or of a water authority in pursuance of its statutory powers and duties;
- (c) the vehicle of the Royal Mail or other universal services provider as defined in Section 27 of the Postal Services Act 2011 to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting mail; or
- (d) vehicles picking up and dropping off passengers.
- 8. Nothing in Article 6 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a Disabled Person's Vehicle which displays in the Relevant Position a Disabled Persons Badge and a Parking Disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait on lengths of sides of roads referred to in the Article for a period not exceeding 3 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than 1 hour from the previous period of waiting by the same vehicle on the same length of side of road on which that vehicle had previously been waiting.

SECTION 3 - PROHIBITION OF WAITING MONDAY TO FRIDAY 8AM TO 6PM

9. Save as provided in Articles 10 and 11 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer, police officer in uniform, or a person authorised by the Council, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time from Monday to Friday inclusive between the hours of 8am to 6pm on the length or lengths of the road or roads referred to in Schedule 3 hereto.

Exemptions

10. Nothing in Article 9 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the side or sides or length or lengths of the road or roads specified therein for as long as may be necessary to enable:-

- (a) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations namely:-
 - (i) building, maintenance, repair, shop fitting or other industrial or demolition operations with a Waiver issued by the Council and displayed in the Relevant Position on the windscreen of the vehicle;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said lengths or sides of the road of any sewer or any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of water, gas electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined by the Telecommunications Act 1984; or
 - (iv) a vehicle being used for police, ambulance, fire brigade or other emergency purposes;
- (b) the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with the service of a local authority or of a water authority in pursuance of its statutory powers and duties;
- (c) the vehicle of the Royal Mail or other universal services provider as defined in Section 27 of the Postal Services Act 2011 to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting mail; or
- (d) vehicles picking up and dropping off passengers.
- 11. Nothing in Article 9 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a Disabled Person's Vehicle which displays in the Relevant Position a Disabled Persons Badge and a Parking Disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait on lengths of sides of roads referred to in the Article for a period not exceeding 3 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than 1 hour from the previous period of waiting by the same vehicle on the same length of side of road on which that vehicle had previously been waiting.

SECTION 4 - PERMIT HOLDERS ONLY AT ANY TIME

- 12. Save as provided in Articles 14 and 15 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer, police officer in uniform, or a person authorised by the Council, cause or permit any vehicle to stop at any time on any of the length or lengths of the road or roads referred to in Schedule 4 hereto.
- 13. Where Article 12 applies no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer, police officer in uniform, or a person authorised by the Council, cause or permit any vehicle displaying a Disabled Person's Badge to wait within a designated permit only parking bay.

Exemptions

- 14. Nothing in Article 12 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle displaying a Physical Parking Permit in the Relevant Position or subject to a Virtual Parking Permit covering the specified area to stop on the side or sides or length or lengths of the road or roads specified in Schedule 4.
- 15. Nothing in Article 12 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to stop on the side or sides or length or lengths of the road or roads specified therein for as long as may be necessary to enable:
 - a. the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations namely:-
 - building, maintenance, repair, shop fitting or other industrial or demolition operations with a Waiver issued by the Council and displayed in the Relevant Position on the windscreen of the vehicle;
 - ii. the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - iii. the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said lengths or sides of the road of any sewer or any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of water, gas electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined by the Telecommunications Act 1984
 - iv. a vehicle being used for police, Ambulance, fire brigade or other emergency purposes

- b. the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with the service of a local authority or of a water authority in pursuance of its statutory powers and duties.
- c. the vehicle of the Royal Mail or other universal services provider as defined in Section 27 of the Postal Services Act 2011 to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting mail.
- d. vehicles picking up and dropping off passengers

SECTION 5 - LIMITED WAITING ONE HOUR NO RETURN WITHIN TWO HOURS, MONDAY TO FRIDAY, 8AM TO 6PM, PERMIT HOLDERS EXEMPT

16. Save as provided in Articles 17, 18 and 19 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer, police officer in uniform, or a person authorised by the Council, cause or permit any vehicle to stop for a period in excess of 2 hours (unless separated by an interval of 2 hours) Monday to Friday inclusive between the hours of 8am and 6pm on any of the length or lengths of the road or roads referred to in Schedule 5 hereto.

Exemptions

- 17. Nothing in Article 16 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle displaying a physical permit in the Relevant Position or subject to a digital permit covering the specified area to stop on the side or sides or length or lengths of the road or roads specified in Schedule 5.
- 18. Nothing in Article 16 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to stop on the side or sides or length or lengths of the road or roads specified therein for as long as may be necessary to enable:
 - a. the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations namely:-
 - building, maintenance, repair, shop fitting or other industrial or demolition operations with a Waiver issued by the Council and displayed in the Relevant Position on the windscreen of the vehicle;
 - ii. the removal of any obstruction to traffic;

- iii. the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said lengths or sides of the road of any sewer or any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of water, gas electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined by the Telecommunications Act 1984; or
- iv. a vehicle being used for police, ambulance, fire brigade or other emergency purposes;
- b. the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with the service of a local authority or of a water authority in pursuance of its statutory powers and duties;

SECTION 6 - DISABLED BADGE HOLDERS AT ANY TIME

20. Save as provided in Articles 21 and 22 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer, police officer in uniform, or a person authorised by the Council, cause or permit any vehicle to wait along any of the length or lengths of the road or roads referred to in Schedule 6 hereto.

Exemptions

21. Nothing in Article 20 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the side or sides or length or lengths of the road or roads specified therein for as long as may be necessary to enable:-

- (a) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations namely:-
 - (i) building, maintenance, repair, shop fitting or other industrial or demolition operations with a Waiver issued by the Council and displayed in the Relevant Position on the windscreen of the vehicle;
 - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
 - (iii) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said lengths or sides of the road of any sewer or any main pipe;
 - (iv) or apparatus for the supply of water, gas electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined by the Telecommunications Act 1984; or
 - (v) a vehicle being used for police, ambulance, fire brigade or other emergency purposes;
- (b) the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with the service of a local authority or of a water authority in pursuance of its statutory powers and duties;
