Any person wishing to challenge the validity of the order or procedures used in making this order may apply to the High Court within 6 weeks of the date the order was made.

## SCHEDULE 1 REVOCATIONS

The existing Orders are revoked insofar as they are inconsistent with the proposals hereinafter contained which relate to the length or lengths of the road or roads referred to in the schedules hereto.

## SCHEDULE 2 DISABLED PERSONS' PARKING PLACES

#### **BIRCHGROVE ROAD**

On its eastern side from a point 97 metres South of its junction with the southern kerbline of Parc Yr Helig Road southwards for a distance of 7 metres (outside No. 164).

#### **KELVIN ROAD**

On its north eastern side from a point 167 metres north west of its junction with the north western kerbline of Carlton Road north west for a distance of 5 metres (outside No. 65).

#### **PENFILIA ROAD**

THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF SWANSEA (hereinafter called "the Council") in exercise of its powers under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended (hereinafter referred to as "the 1984 Act"), the Traffic Management Act 2004("the 2004 Act"), the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 ("the 1976 Act") and all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 and Section 124 of the 1984 Act hereby makes the following Order.

#### **SECTION 1 - PRELIMINARY**

#### Citation and commencement

 This Order shall come into operation on 24<sup>th</sup> April 2025 and may be cited as the Council of the City and County of Swansea, Various Locations, Various Parking Restrictions, Swansea Order 2025

#### **Definitions**

2. In this order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meaning hereby respectively assigned to them:

"Civil Enforcement Officer" has the same meaning as in Section 63A of the 1984 Act and by virtue of Section 76 of the 2004 Act a Civil Enforcement Officer appointed under Section 63A of the 1984 Act is a Civil Enforcement Officer in relation to parking contraventions;

"Disabled Person's Vehicle" has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemption for Disabled Persons) (Wales) Regulations 2000;

"Disabled Person's Badge" has the same meaning as in the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles)(Wales) Regulation 2000;

"Parking Disc" means a disc and time clock (where appropriate) issued by a local authority complying with the requirements of the British Standard Specifications for Page 2 of 12

Parking Discs to comply with the European Blue Badge Scheme being a disc coloured blue and capable of showing the quarter hour period during which a period of waiting begins;

"Parking Permit" means a Virtual Parking Permit or Physical Parking Permit issued by the Council covering the relevant length of road and is displayed in the Relevant Position:

"Physical Parking Permit" means a paper permit that the Council has issued to a resident who has satisfied the Council, by formal application;

"Relevant Position" in respect of:-

- (a) a Disabled Person's Badge and parking disc has the same meaning as in the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Exemptions for Disabled Persons) (Wales) Regulations 2000; and
- (b) a Waiver means exhibited on the windscreen, dashboard or fascia of the vehicle or, where the vehicle does not have a windscreen, dashboard or fascia, in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that the whole of the information on the front of the waiver is clearly legible from outside the vehicle;

"Virtual Parking Permit" means an electronic record of parking ticket, permit or dispensation issued and confirmed by the Council to exempt a vehicle from a restriction or to make payment other than on site covered in the provisions of this order, under the terms applicable at the time of issue. A Virtual Parking Permit may be obtained by any of the methods provided from time to time by the Council and to be valid must be registered on an account in an electronic database approved by the Council with an indication that the permit has been issued and validated in accordance with Council procedures; and

"Waiver" means a Waiver issued by the Council in respect of vehicles being used for building maintenance repair shop fitting or other industrial or demolition operations and the Council may charge for such waiver such charge to be determined from time to time by resolution of the Council or relevant Committee thereof.

#### <u>Interpretation</u>

- Except where otherwise stated, any reference in this Order to a numbered Article or Schedule is a reference to the Article or Schedule bearing that number in this Order
- 4. The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the Interpretation of an Act of Parliament
- The prohibitions and restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any other prohibition or restriction whether made under the 1984 Act or otherwise

#### **SECTION 2 - DISABLED PERSONS' PARKING PLACES**

6. Save as provided in Articles 7 and 8 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer, police officer in uniform, or a person authorised by the Council, cause or permit any vehicle to wait along any of the length or lengths of the road or roads referred to in Schedule 2 hereto.

#### Exemptions

- 7. Nothing in Article 6 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the side or sides or length or lengths of the road or roads specified therein for as long as may be necessary to enable:-
  - (a) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations namely:-
    - (i) building, maintenance, repair, shop fitting or other industrial or demolition operations with a Waiver issued by the Council and displayed in the Relevant Position on the windscreen of the vehicle;
    - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
    - (iii) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said lengths or sides of the road of any sewer or any main pipe;
    - (iv) or apparatus for the supply of water, gas electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined by the Telecommunications Act 1984; or
    - (v) a vehicle being used for police, ambulance, fire brigade or other emergency purposes;

- (b) the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with the service of a local authority or of a water authority in pursuance of its statutory powers and duties;
- (c) the vehicle of the Royal Mail or other universal services provider as defined in Section 27 of the Postal Services Act 2011 to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting mail; or
- (d) vehicles picking up and dropping off passengers.
- 8. Nothing in Article 6 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a Disabled Person's Vehicle which displays in the Relevant Position a Disabled Persons Badge and a Parking Disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) on the lengths and sides of roads referred to in the Article.

#### **SECTION 3 - RESIDENT PERMIT HOLDERS**

- 9. Save as provided in Articles 11 and 12 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer, police officer in uniform, or a person authorised by the Council, cause or permit any vehicle to stop at any time on any of the length or lengths of the road or roads referred to in Schedule 3 hereto.
- 10. Where Article 9 applies no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer, police officer in uniform, or a person authorised by the Council, cause or permit any vehicle displaying a Disabled Person's Badge to wait within a designated permit only parking bay.

#### **Exemptions**

- 11. Nothing in Article 9 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle displaying a Physical Parking Permit in the Relevant Position or subject to a Virtual Parking Permit covering the specified area to stop on the side or sides or length or lengths of the road or roads specified in Schedule 3.
- 12. Nothing in Article 9 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to stop on the side or sides or length or lengths of the road or roads specified therein for as long as may be necessary to enable:-

- (a) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations namely:-
  - (i) building, maintenance, repair, shop fitting or other industrial or demolition operations with a Waiver issued by the Council and displayed in the Relevant Position on the windscreen of the vehicle;
  - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
  - (iii) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said lengths or sides of the road of any sewer or any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of water, gas electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined by the Telecommunications Act 1984; or
  - (iv) a vehicle being used for police, ambulance, fire brigade or other emergency purposes;
- (b) the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with the service of a local authority or of a water authority in pursuance of its statutory powers and duties;
- (c) the vehicle of the Royal Mail or other universal services provider as defined in Section 27 of the Postal Services Act 2011 to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting mail; or
- (d) vehicles picking up and dropping off passengers.

## SECTION 4 - LIMITED WAITING 1 HOUR NO RETURN WITHIN 2 HOURS MON-SAT 8AM - 6PM RESIDENT PERMIT HOLDERS EXEMPT

13. Save as provided in Articles 14, 15 and 16 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer, police officer in uniform, or a person authorised by the Council, cause or permit any vehicle to stop for a period in excess of 1 hour (unless separated by an interval of 2 hours) Monday to Saturday inclusive between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on any of the length or lengths of the road or roads referred to in Schedule 4 hereto.

#### **Exemptions**

14. Nothing in Article 13 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a vehicle displaying a Physical Parking Permit in the Relevant Position or subject to a Virtual

- Parking Permit covering the specified area to stop on the side or sides or length or lengths of the road or roads specified in Schedule 4.
- 15. Nothing in Article 13 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to stop on the side or sides or length or lengths of the road or roads specified therein for as long as may be necessary to enable:-
  - (a) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations namely:-
    - (i) building, maintenance, repair, shop fitting or other industrial or demolition operations with a Waiver issued by the Council and displayed in the Relevant Position on the windscreen of the vehicle;
    - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
    - (iii) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said lengths or sides of the road of any sewer or any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of water, gas electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined by the Telecommunications Act 1984; or
    - (iv) a vehicle being used for police, ambulance, fire brigade or other emergency purposes;
  - (b) the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with the service of a local authority or of a water authority in pursuance of its statutory powers and duties;
  - (c) the vehicle of the Royal Mail or other universal services provider as defined in Section 27 of the Postal Services Act 2011 to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting mail; or
  - (d) vehicles picking up and dropping off passengers.
- 16. Nothing in Article 13 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a disabled person's vehicle which displays in the Relevant Position a Disabled Persons Badge and a Parking Disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait on the length and sides of roads referred to in the Article for a period not exceeding 3 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than 1 hour from the previous period of waiting by the same vehicle on the same length of side of road on which that vehicle had previously been waiting.

#### **SECTION 5 - PROHIBITION OF WAITING AT ANY TIME**

17. Save as provided in Articles 18 and 19 no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Civil Enforcement Officer, police officer in uniform, or a person authorised by the Council, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time on the length or lengths of the road or roads referred to in Schedule 5 hereto.

#### **Exemptions**

- 18. Nothing in Article 17 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait on the side or sides or length or lengths of the road or roads specified therein for as long as may be necessary to enable:-
  - (a) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations namely:-
    - (i) building, maintenance, repair, shop fitting or other industrial or demolition operations with a Waiver issued by the Council and displayed in the Relevant Position on the windscreen of the vehicle;
    - (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
    - (iii) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in or on land adjacent to the said lengths or sides of the road of any sewer or any main pipe or apparatus for the supply of water, gas electricity or of any telecommunications apparatus as defined by the Telecommunications Act 1984; or
    - (iv) a vehicle being used for police, ambulance, fire brigade or other emergency purposes;
  - (b) the vehicle if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with the service of a local authority or of a water authority in pursuance of its statutory powers and duties;
  - (c) the vehicle of the Royal Mail or other universal services provider as defined in Section 27 of the Postal Services Act 2011 to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting mail; or
  - (d) vehicles picking up and dropping off passengers.

19. Nothing in Article 17 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit a Disabled Person's Vehicle which displays in the Relevant Position a Disabled Persons Badge and a Parking Disc (on which the driver, or other person in charge of the vehicle, has marked the time at which the period of waiting began) to wait on lengths of sides of roads referred to in the Article for a period not exceeding 3 hours (not being a period separated by an interval of less than 1 hour from the previous period of waiting by the same vehicle on the same length of side of road on which that vehicle had previously been waiting.

#### **REVOCATION**

20. The existing Orders are revoked insofar as they are inconsistent with the proposals contained in the schedules hereto and insofar as they relate to the length or lengths of the road or roads referred to in the Schedule hereto.

#### **LLANGYFELACH ROAD**

On its eastern side from a point 24 metres north of its junction with the northern kerbline of Bryn Terrace northwards for a distance of 5 metres (outside No 411).

#### TREWYDDFA TERRACE

On its eastern side from its common boundary with no 22 and 23 Trewyddfa Terrace to its common boundary with 23 and 24 Trewyddfa Terrace for a distance of 5 metres (outside No 23).

#### **LAN STREET**

On its eastern side from a point 5 metres south of its junction with the southern kerbline of Bath Avenue southwards for a distance of 6 metres.

#### **QUEENS ROAD, MUMBLES**

On its northern side from a point 83 metres east of its junction with the eastern kerbline of Stanley Street eastwards for a distance of 5 metres (outside No 17).

On its northern side from a point 90 metres east of its junction with the eastern kerbline of the access road to Danygraig Cemetery eastwards for a distance for a distance of 5 metres (outside No 131).



## Notice of Intent for the Traffic Regulation Order DISABLED PERSONS PARKING SPACE – VARIOUS WARDS PROPOSALS

The provision of:

Double yellow lines is for the purpose of improving road safety at road junctions for motorists and pedestrians.

Disabled persons parking places is for the purpose of assisting disabled persons to park outside their homes.

The increase in the length of resident parking bays is to compensate for the placing of a disabled persons' parking place within that bay.

The increase of limited waiting with permit holders exempt bay is to compensate for the placing of a disabled persons' parking place within that bay.


What a traffic regulation order may provide.


- (1) A traffic regulation order may make any provision prohibiting, restricting or regulating the use of a road, or of any part of the width of a road, by vehicular traffic, or by vehicular traffic of any class specified in the order,—
- (a) either generally or subject to such exceptions as may be specified in the order or determined in a manner provided for by it, and
- (b) subject to such exceptions as may be so specified or determined, either at all times or at times, on days or during periods so specified.
































