Location:-

Set back from the main road at the junction with a short lane, in the centre of the village. The front faces E.

History:-

Early C19, late Georgian house. The doorway is lower than the windows, suggesting that the house may have earlier origins. Marked as a post-office on the 1st edition Ordnance Survey of 1877.

Exterior:-

Symmetrical 3-window, 2-storey house. Constructed of rendered rubble under a slate roof with stone end stacks. Recessed 12-pane hornless sash windows with slightly cambered heads and stone sills. Doorway under similar, lower head, containing a C20 planked door. To the R is a single-storey range of rubble stone, with a multi-pane window to the front, and a planked door with hatch above to N gable end. Continuous lean-to at rear of house with stack to R. Central doorway flanked by a 6-pane sash window to L and a casement window to R. Skylight is lean-to roof. C20 half-lit door in angle of house and lower range.

Interior:-

Narrow central stair hall with stairs immediately behind front door, flanked by reception rooms.

Listed:-

Listed for its special interest as an especially well preserved early C19 building in the centre of the village.
