


DUNVANT WARD PROFILE

Information, Research & GIS (Strategic Delivery Unit), April 2022

The information in this profile relates to the former ward prior to the Council elections on 5 May 2022.

- **Population: 4,300** (source: mid-2020 estimates, rounded Office for National Statistics / ONS)
- Location: Approximately 5.6 kilometres west of the city centre, consisting of the Dunvant locality, north-west of Killay
- Neighbouring Wards: Killay North, Killay South, Fairwood, Gowerton
- Constituency area (Welsh Government / UK Parliament): Swansea West
- Area: 243 hectares / 2.43 km² (ONS, 2020)
- Population Density (2020): 1,753 people per km²
- **Population Change** (2015 to 2020): 0 / 0% (ONS estimates, rounded)
- **Employment**: 250 (ONS workplace estimate, 2020). Major employers: Swansea Council (primary schools).






ABOUT THE WARD

Dunvant grew as a small village around the coal mining that took place in the area during the 1800s. This period saw the development of some terraced housing. Ribbon development took place in the 1920s and 1930s along the main roads, but the majority of the housing was built from the 1960s onwards in the east of the Ward.

The ward contains a mix of housing types with a high proportion of semi-detached and detached dwellings; the great majority of which are owner occupied.

SOCIO-ECONOMIC DATA

Estimates of average net annual household income for Dunvant are available via ONS model-based estimates at MSOA (Middle Super Output Area) level for 2015/16. The figure for Swansea 020, the MSOA which most closely aligns to the ward (see map adjacent), is £29,000; the 10th highest (of 31 MSOAs) in Swansea and 8% above the Swansea median of £26,900.



NS-SeC data (socio-economic position based on occupation) for the ward indicates a higher than average proportion of managerial/professional and intermediate occupations (NS-SeC classes 1-4) and a lower proportion of routine/manual (NS-SeC classes 5-7).



WELSH INDEX OF MULTIPLE DEPRIVATION

- WIMD 2014 based on Lower Super Output Area (LSOA) geography – Dunvant consists of three LSOAs.
- ➤ Dunvant 1 emerges as the more deprived LSOA in the Ward (ranking 95th out of 148 in Swansea, and 1,501st of 1,909 in Wales). Dunvant 3 is the least deprived of the three LSOAs, ranking 134 in Swansea and 1,808 within Wales.
- ➤ The higher level of deprivation attributed to Dunvant 1 is reflected in the relatively higher rankings in the education and health domains.
- ➤ However no Dunvant LSOA has a domain ranking in the 50% most deprived in Wales.
