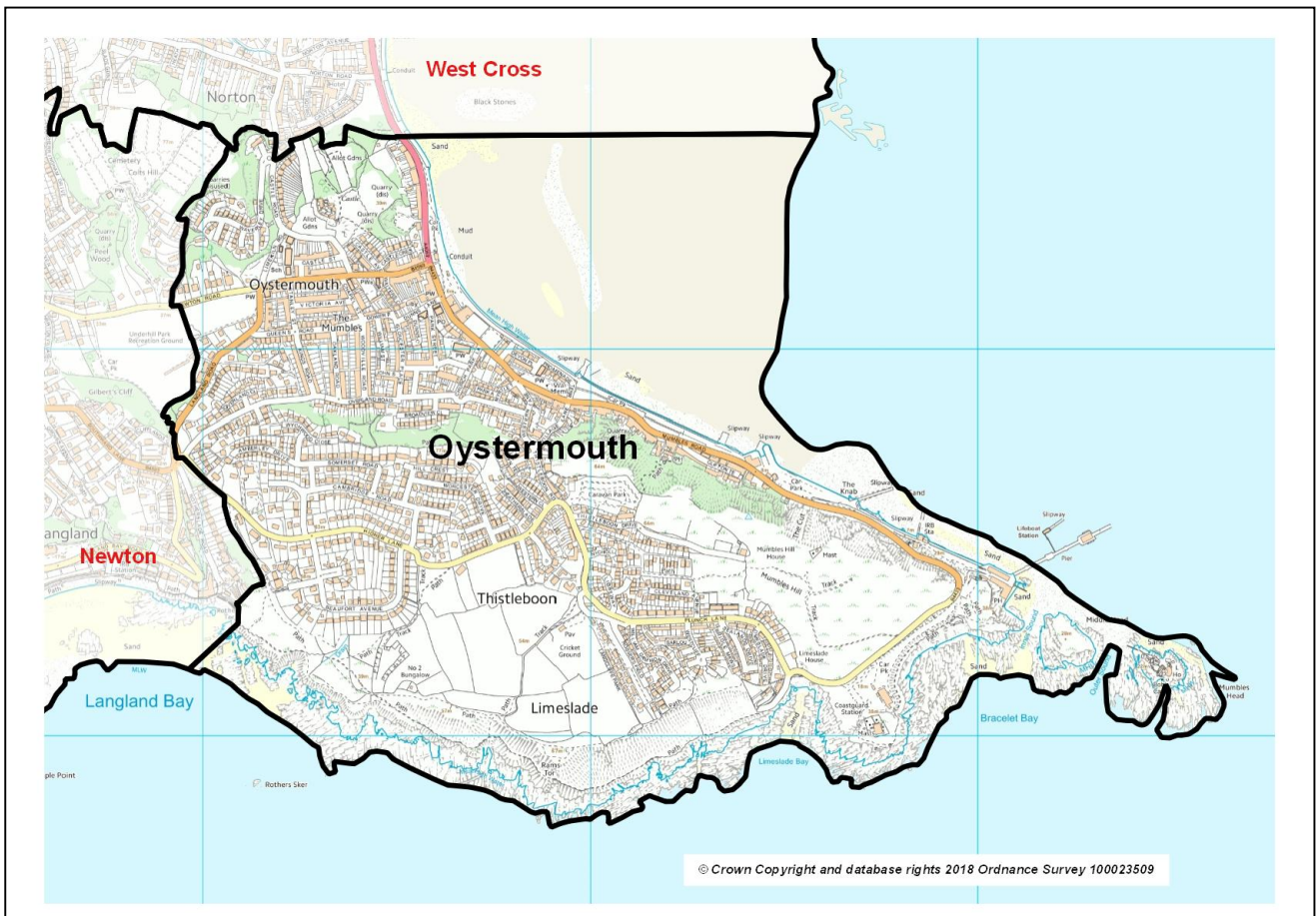


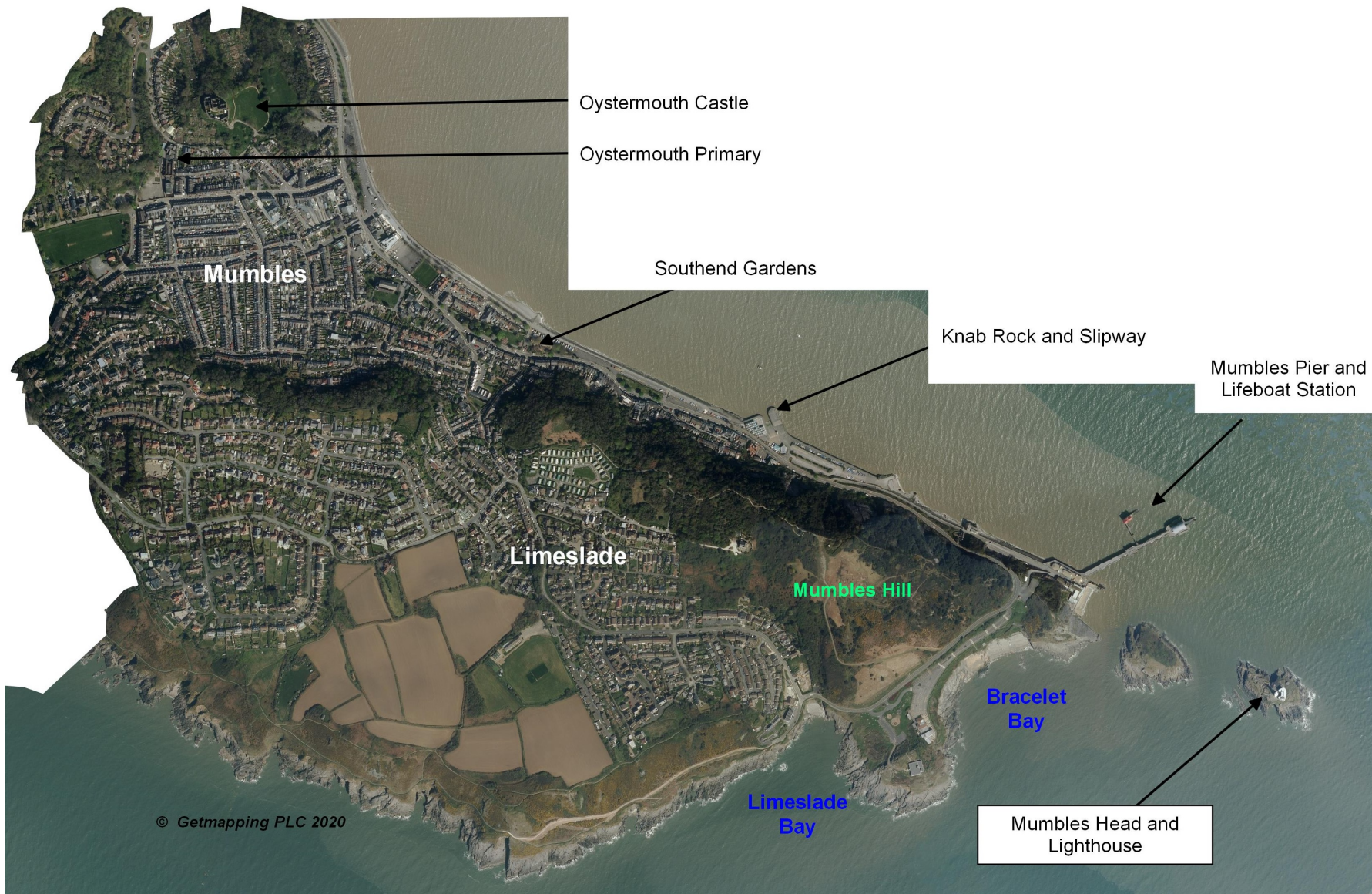

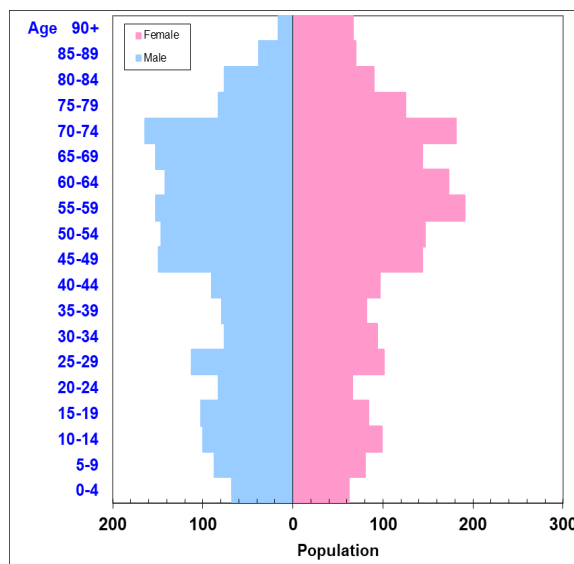
- **Population:** 4,000 (source: mid-2020 estimates, rounded - Office for National Statistics / ONS)
- **Location:** Approximately 7 kilometres south-west of the city centre, consisting mainly of the Mumbles locality
- **Neighbouring Wards:** Newton, West Cross
- **Constituency area (Welsh Government / UK Parliament):** Gower
- **Area:** 205 hectares / 2.05 km² (ONS, 2020)
- **Population Density (2020):** 1,959 people per km²
- **Population Change (2015 to 2020):** -100 / -1% (ONS estimates, rounded)
- **Employment:** 1,500 (ONS workplace estimate, 2020). Major employers: leisure and tourism businesses in the hotel, restaurant and retail sectors.

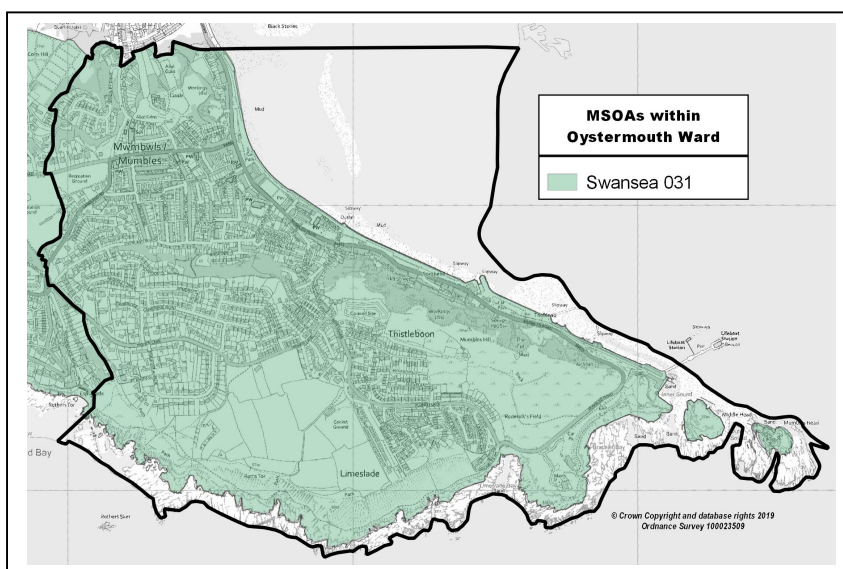
ABOUT THE WARD

Oystermouth is located at the most southerly point of Swansea's south-western suburban development. The ward consists of the coastal village of Oystermouth, which doubles as a suburban shopping centre and holiday resort, and is commonly known as Mumbles after the three outcrops of rock at the western end of the bay.

Development initially occurred around the area of Oystermouth Castle and the lower coastal strip from the early 19th century, particularly following the opening of the Oystermouth-Swansea passenger railway service in 1807 and the area's subsequent popularity as a tourist destination. Further housing development occurred in the higher land areas to the south (such as Limeslade and Thistleboon) in the post-war period.

SOCIO-ECONOMIC DATA

- Estimates of average net annual household income for Oystermouth are available via ONS model-based estimates at MSOA (Middle Super Output Area) level for 2015/16. The figure for Swansea 031, the MSOA which most closely aligns to the ward (see map adjacent), is £30,300; the 4th highest (of 31 MSOAs) in Swansea and 13% above the Swansea median of £26,900.



- NS-SeC data (socio-economic position based on occupation) for the ward indicates a higher than average level of managerial and professionals (NS-SeC classes 1-2) and lower proportions of routine and manual occupations (NS-SeC classes 5-7).

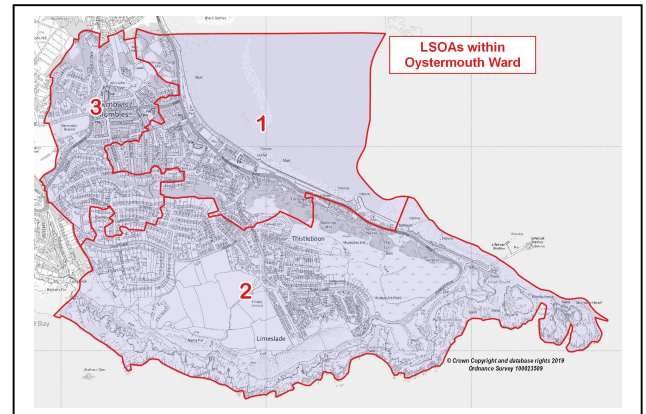

WELSH INDEX OF MULTIPLE DEPRIVATION

- WIMD 2019 based on Lower Super Output Area (LSOA) geography – Oystermouth consists of three LSOAs.
- Oystermouth 1 ranked most deprived in overall index (116th of 148 in Swansea, 1719th of 1,909 in Wales), with Oystermouth 3 ranking as the least deprived of the area's LSOAs (136 in Swansea, 1826 in Wales).
- In the individual domains, Oystermouth 2 (the southernmost LSOA in the ward) ranks relatively highly in the access to services domain (840 in Wales).
- Oystermouth 1 and 3 are ranked relatively highly in the housing domain (both in the fourth decile in Wales).
