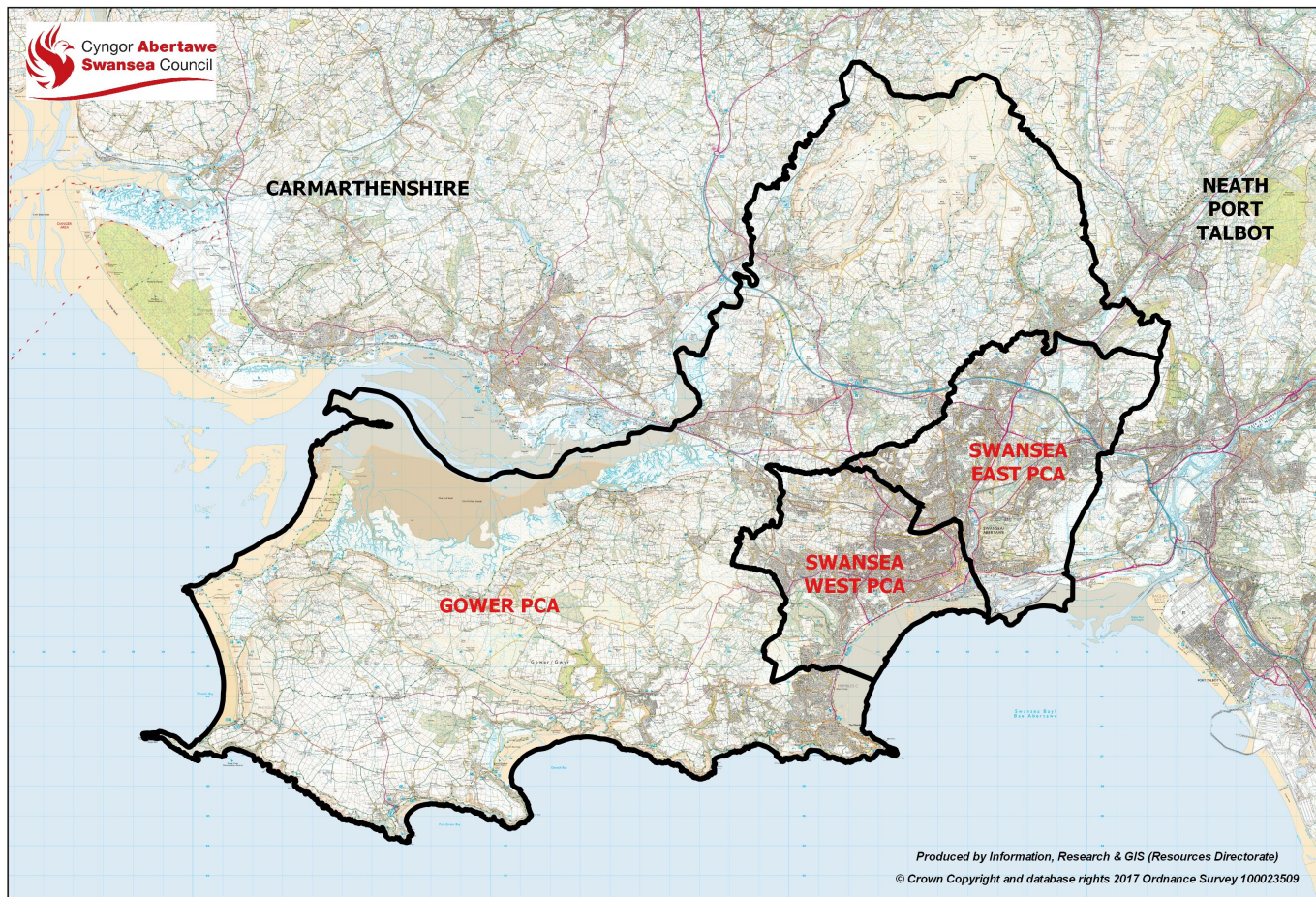

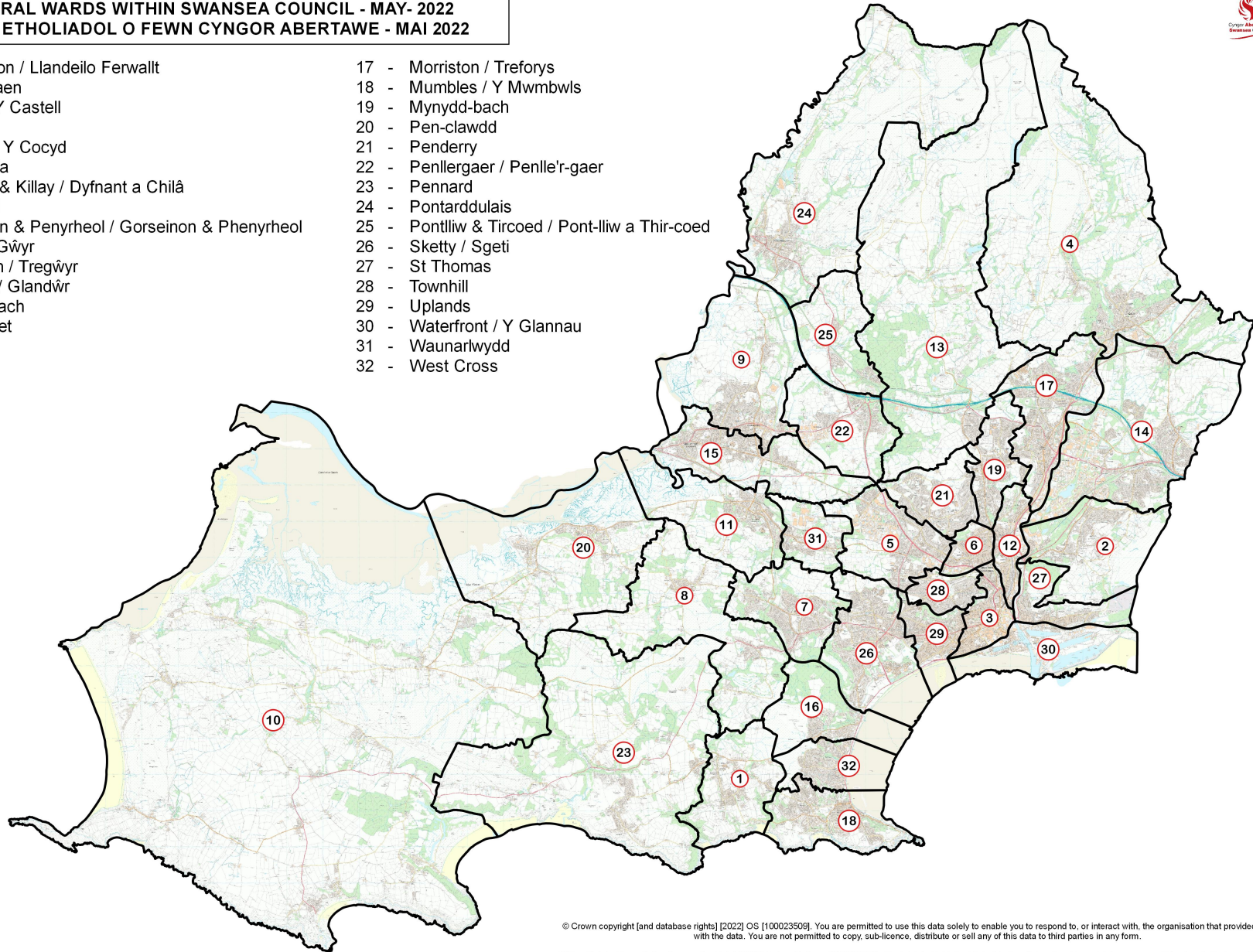


- **Location:** Situated on the South West Wales coast, Swansea is Wales' second largest city. The wider county area also includes a number of suburban centres, and the more rural Gower peninsula and Lliw uplands areas.
- **Adjacent local authorities:** Carmarthenshire, Neath Port Talbot.
- **Constituency areas (Welsh Government / UK Parliament):** Gower, Swansea East and Swansea West.
- **Population:** 237,800 (source: mid-2021 rounded estimates, Office for National Statistics)
- **Area:** 378 square kilometres (km²).
- **Population Density:** 630 people per km² (ONS 2021)
- **Population Change:** -900 / -0.4% (2011 to 2021 mid-year estimates, ONS).
- **Employment (ONS workplace estimate, 2021):** 108,000.

Summary

- 3rd highest local authority area population in Wales, and 5th highest population density (mid-2021).
- Higher proportion of young people aged 16-24, in part due to students.
- Slightly lower percentages of children (aged 5-15) and residents aged 45-74.
- Higher proportions (than the Wales average) of people born outside the UK and in non-white ethnic group (2021 Census).
- Lower percentage of people able to speak Welsh than Wales average.
- Slightly higher proportion of adults with higher (level 4+) qualifications.
- Smaller average household size than Wales.
- Higher proportions of one person (under 66) and other household types.
- Larger percentage of semi-detached housing and flats, maisonettes or apartments than Wales averages.
- Below average levels of home ownership and higher percentage of households in Council and private rented tenures.
- Below average economic activity rates and lower proportions of employee and self-employed residents, and higher economic inactivity rates – mostly due to students.
