

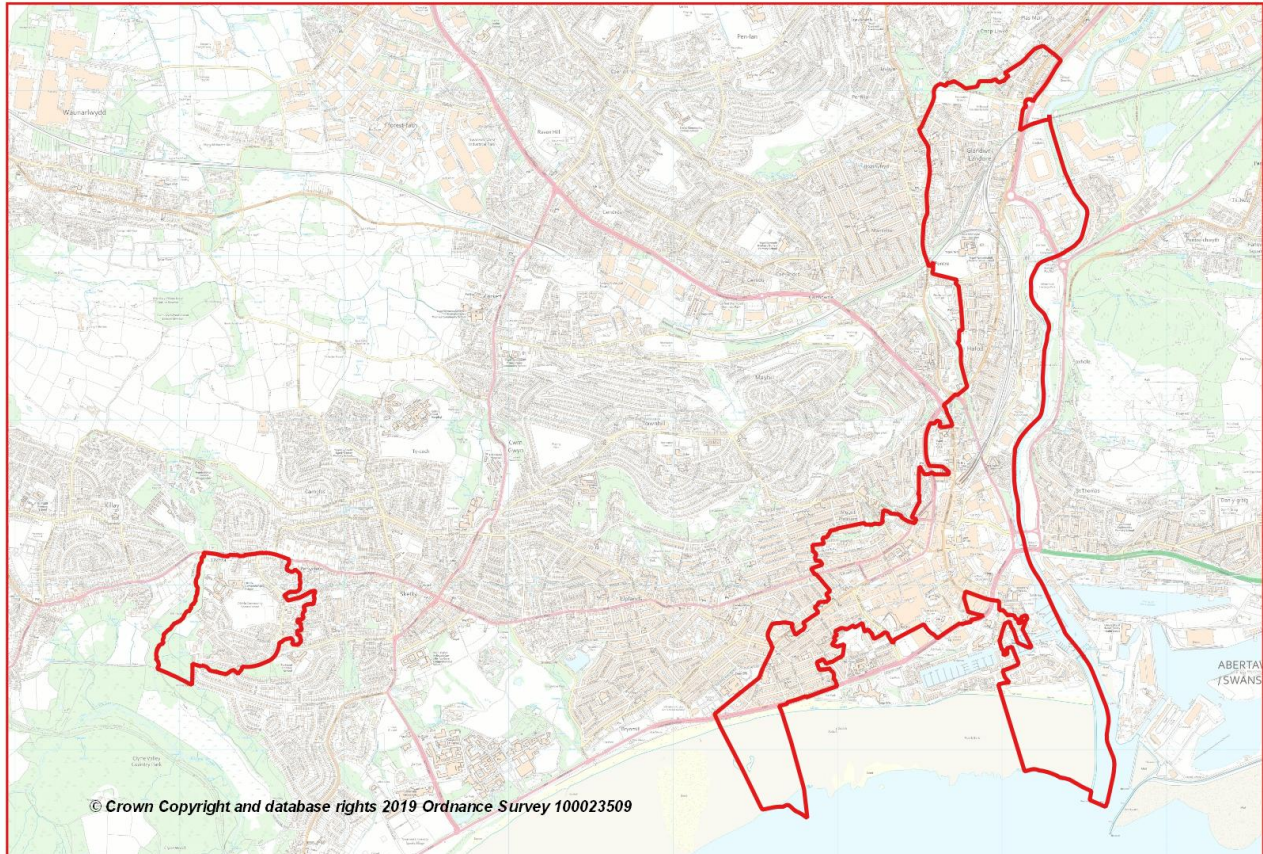

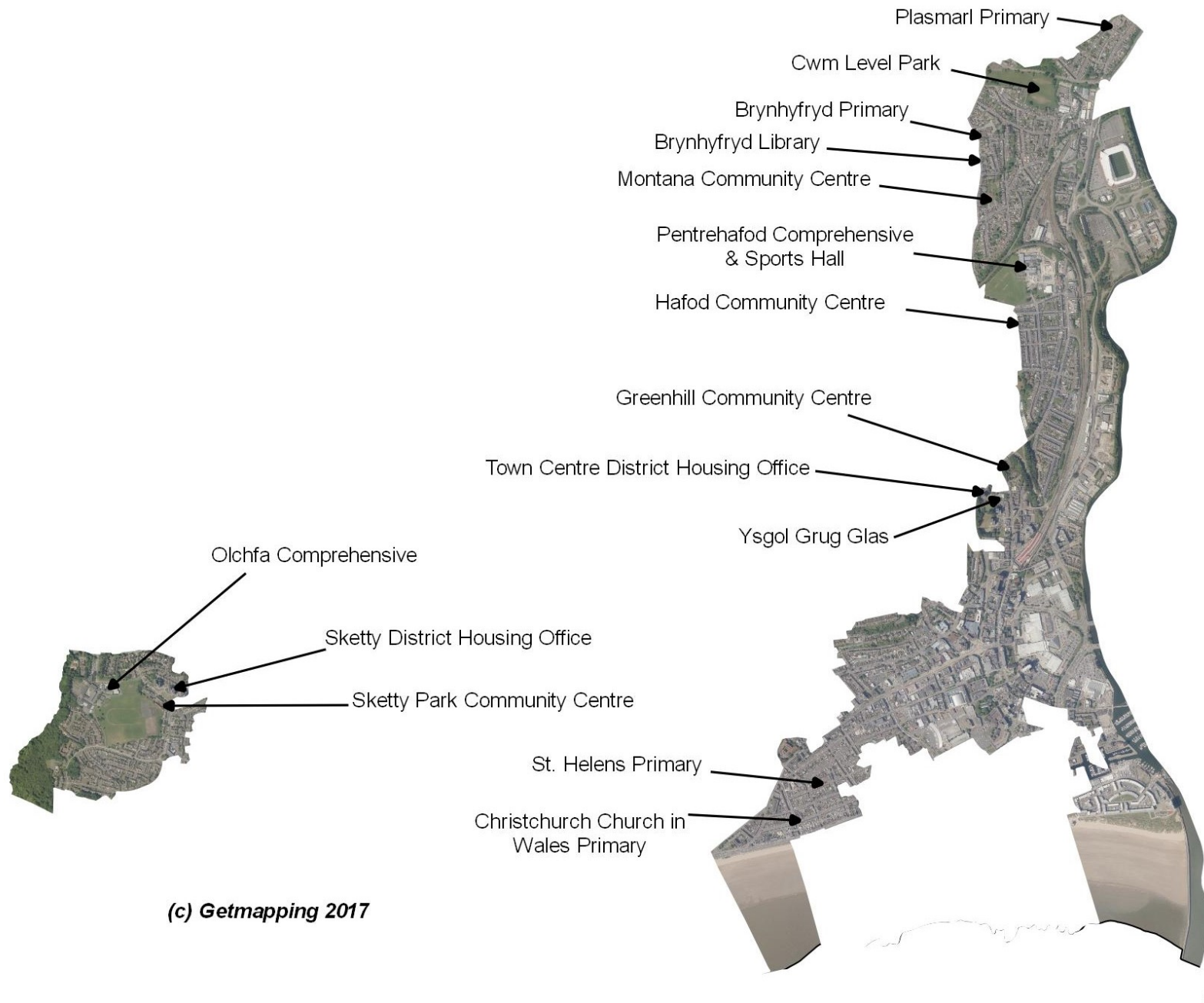

Constituency area (Welsh Government / UK Parliament): Swansea East & West.



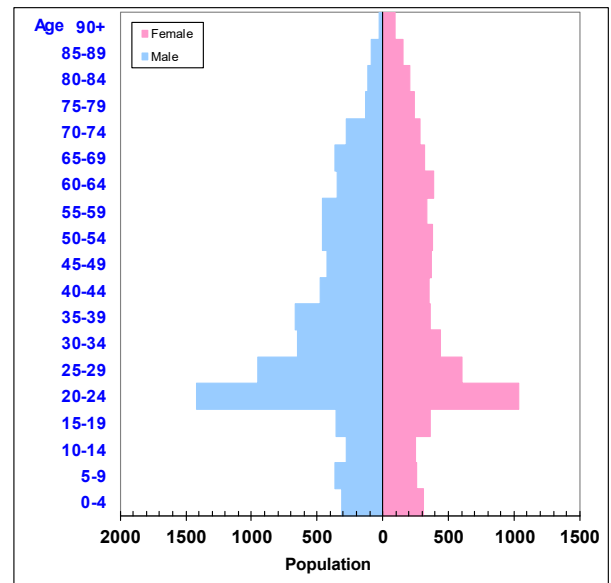
- **Location:** Consisting of the communities of Sandfields, Dyfatty, Hafod, Landore, Brynhyfryd and Plasmarl around the city centre and west of the River Tawe, plus the Sketty Park community separately to the west
- **Area Wards:** Castle (part), Landore (part), Sketty (part)
- **Area:** 352 hectares / 3.5 km² (2011 Census)
- **Population Density (2018):** 4,236 people per km²
- **Population Change (2008 to 2018):** +2,600 / +21% (ONS estimates, rounded)
- **Employment:** 19,000 (ONS workplace estimate, 2018). Major employers: City Centre and adjacent businesses, Liberty Stadium, Morfa Industrial Estate occupiers, Swansea Council schools and community facilities.

- Lower proportion of young people (aged 0-15) and those aged 45 and over (2018)
- Higher percentage of population aged 16-44 than Swansea average
- High proportion of people in non-white ethnic groups and born outside UK (2011 Census)
- Significantly higher level of one person households, especially aged under 65
- Lower proportion of couple households
- A far higher percentage of household accommodation is terraced or flats
- Larger percentage of social rented (especially RSL/HA) and private rented housing.

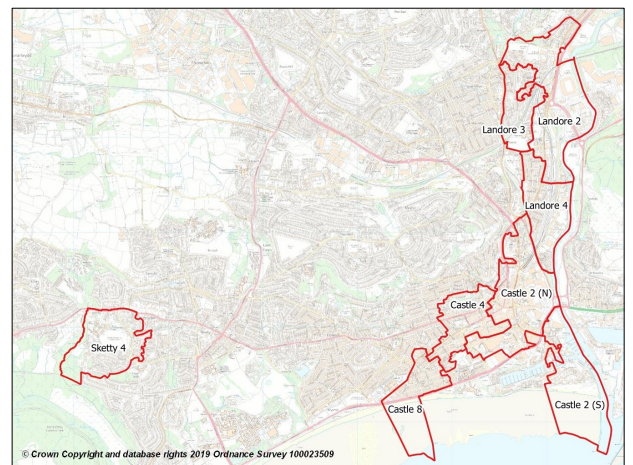

WELSH INDEX OF MULTIPLE DEPRIVATION (WIMD) 2019

- Castle 2 North (2N) is the most deprived Lower Super Output Area (LSOA) of eight in the Delivery Area, ranking 36 out of 1,909 in Wales, followed by Landore 2. Castle 2 South (2S) is the least deprived in the area, ranking 1034 within Wales.
- The higher deprivation in Castle 2N is especially apparent in the community safety, employment, health and income domains. Castle 4 is ranked highly in housing and community safety.

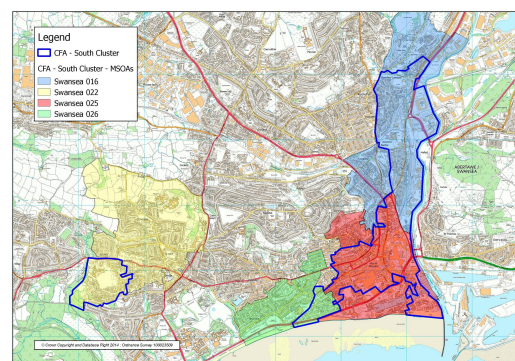

SOCIO-ECONOMIC CHARACTERISTICS

- Local estimates of average net annual household income are available via ONS model-based estimates at MSOA (Middle Super Output Area) level for 2015/16. The figure for Swansea 025, the MSOA which most closely aligns to the South Delivery Area (see map adjacent), is £22,200; the 4th lowest (of 31 MSOAs) in Swansea and 17% below the Swansea median of £26,900.



- NS-SeC data (socio-economic position based on occupation) indicates a slightly above average percentage of routine and manual occupations (NS-SeC classes 5-7) and 'not classified' (full-time students), and lower proportions of managerial and professional occupations (NS-SeC classes 1-2).
